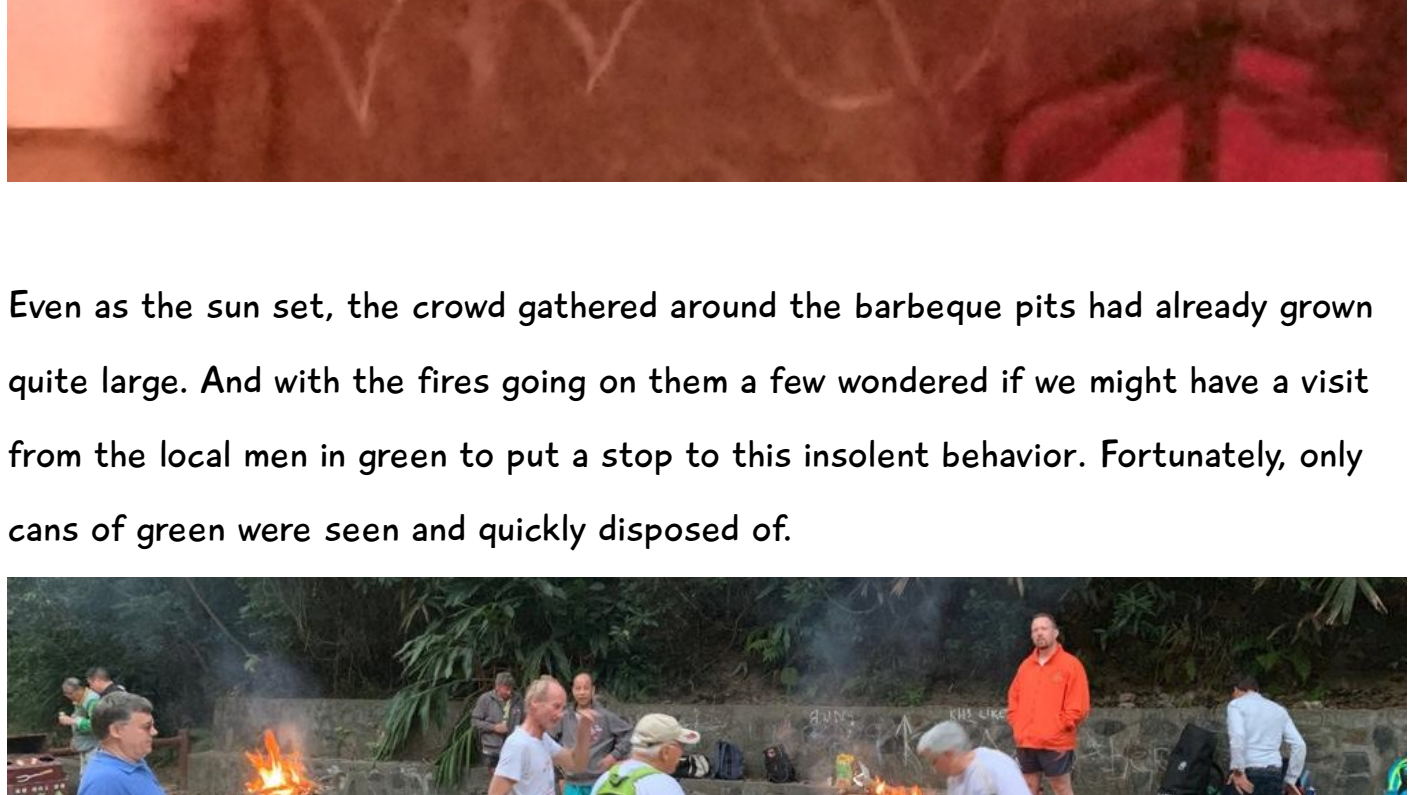

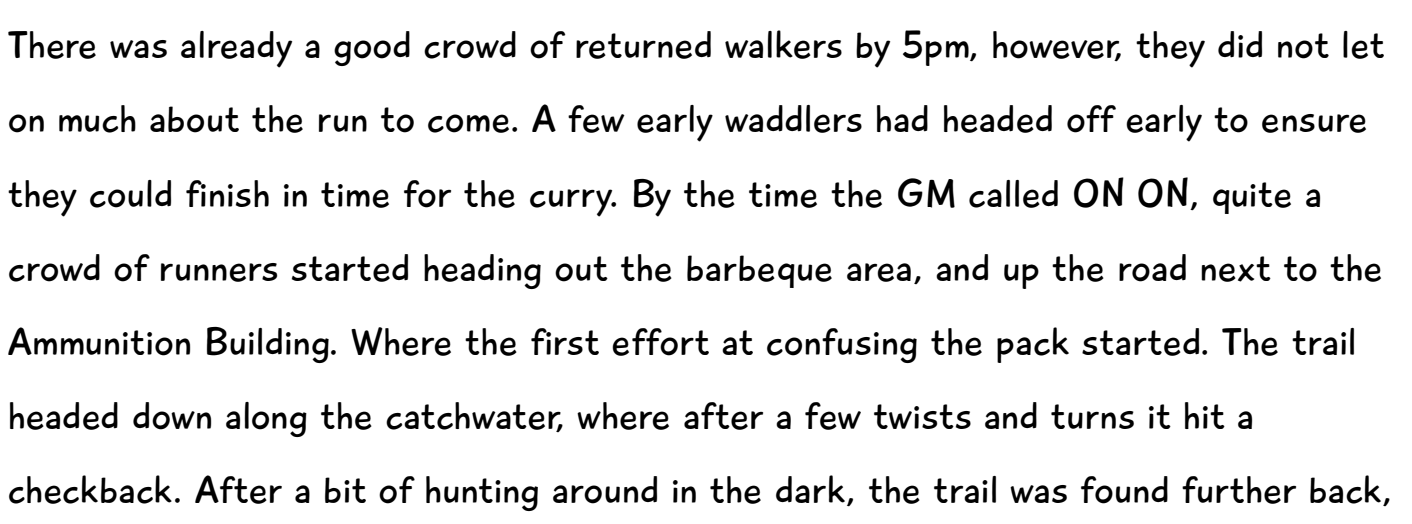

The Run

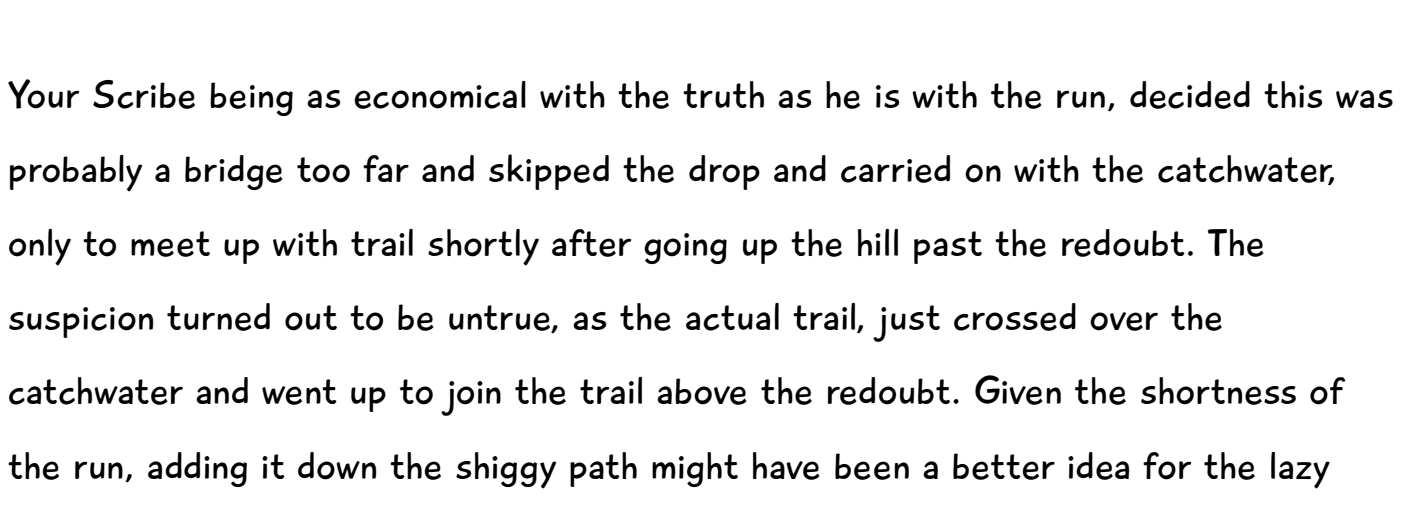

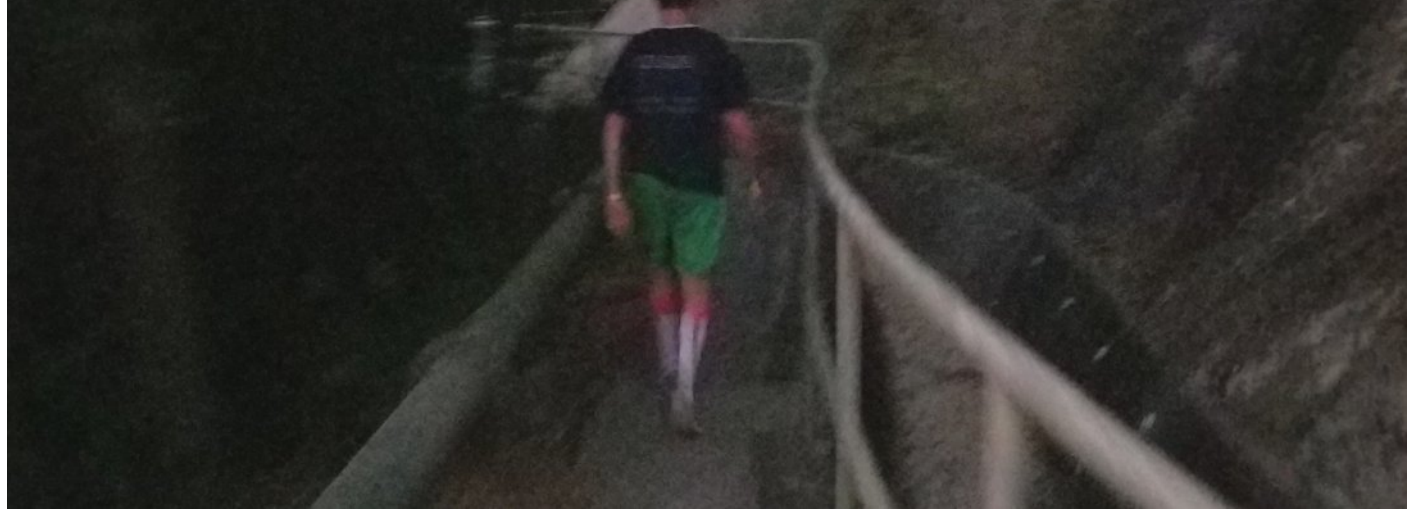
In some apparent bit of missplanning, it appears that KH3 had taken refuge at the pits the week before, as several unusual markings and candy were found on the walls around the start

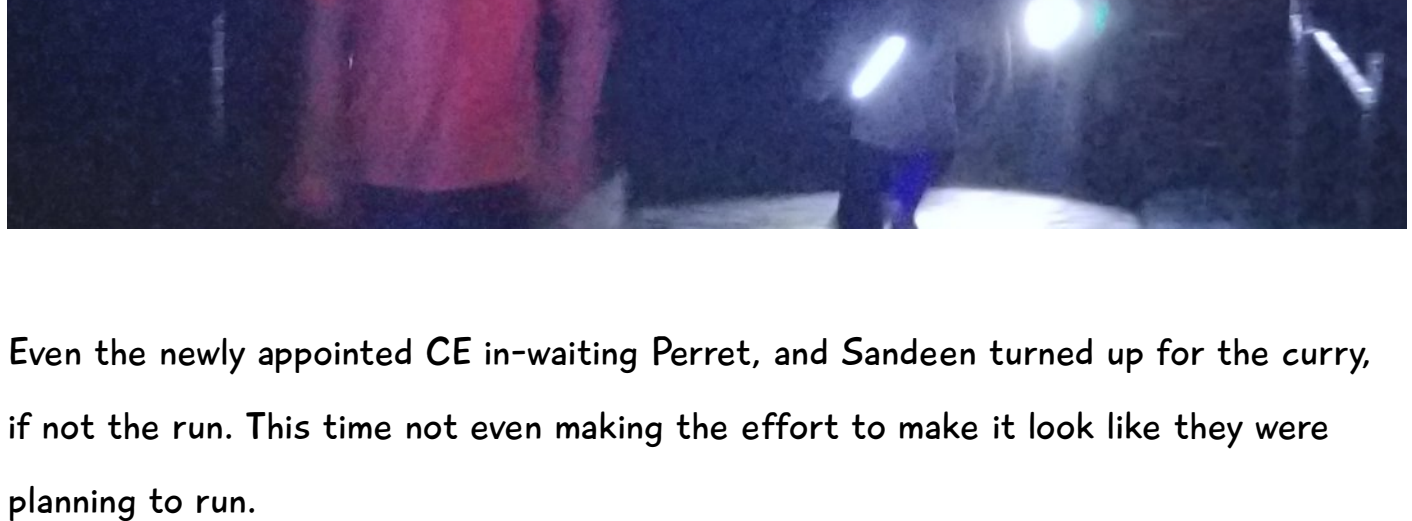

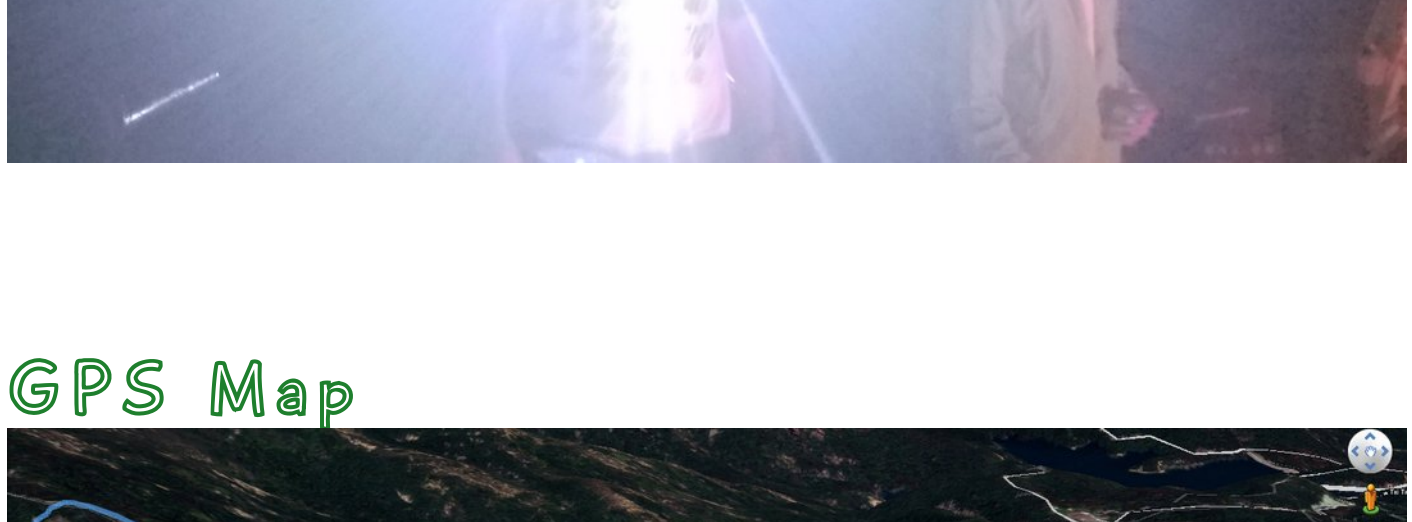
So following the redoubt, the trail continued up the hill following a well-travelled H4 route up to the Hong Kong trail, before gently heading back down to the barbeque pits.

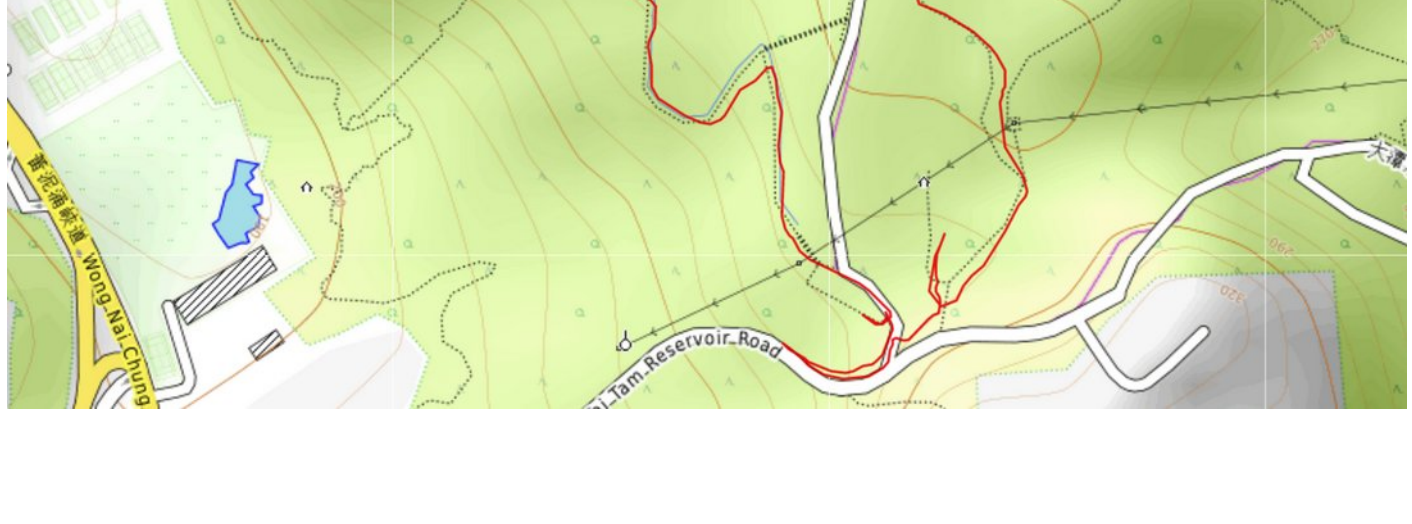
Most of the pack arrived back in one bunch, apparently not much of a trail to split them up, and like a sea of fireflies arrived back torches filling up the hillside.



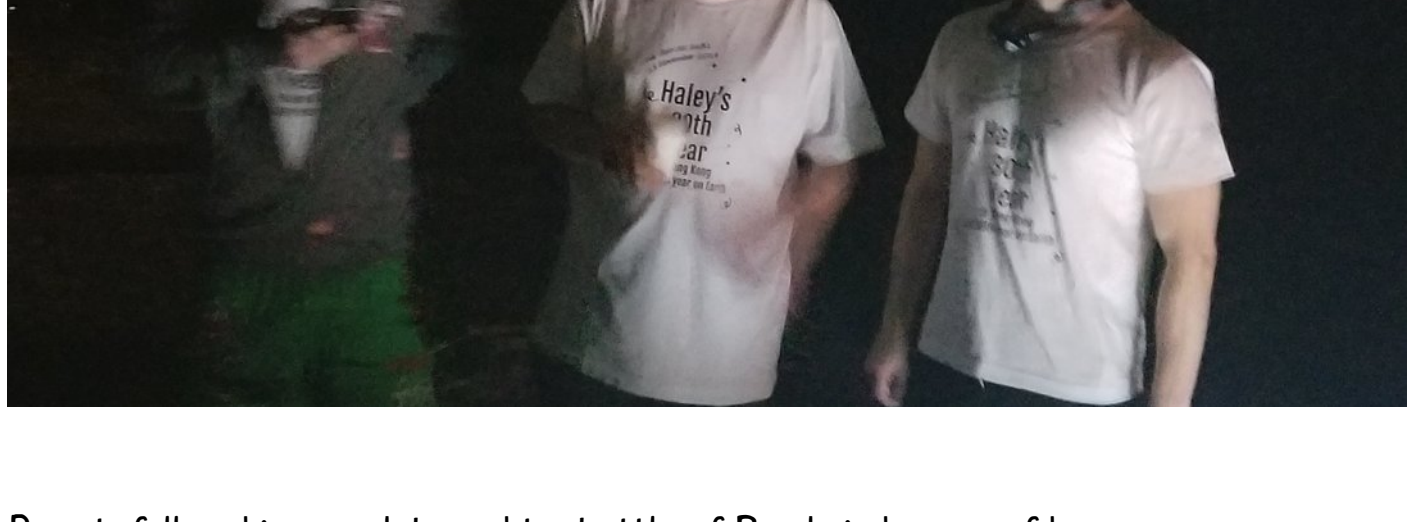
As our new regular visitor George arrived back, having started a little late, the GM considering the rather short length, inquired if he had done the second lap, like the rest of the pack.

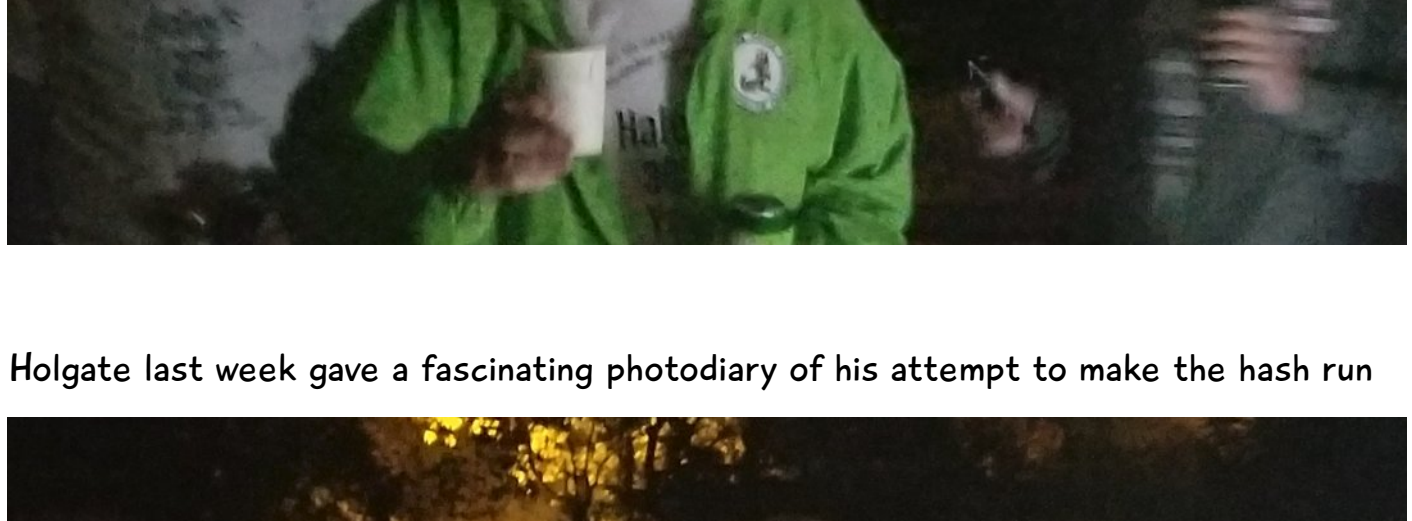
Even the newly appointed CE in-waiting Perret, and Sandeen turned up for the curry, if not the run. This time not even making the effort to make it look like they were planning to run.



GPS Map

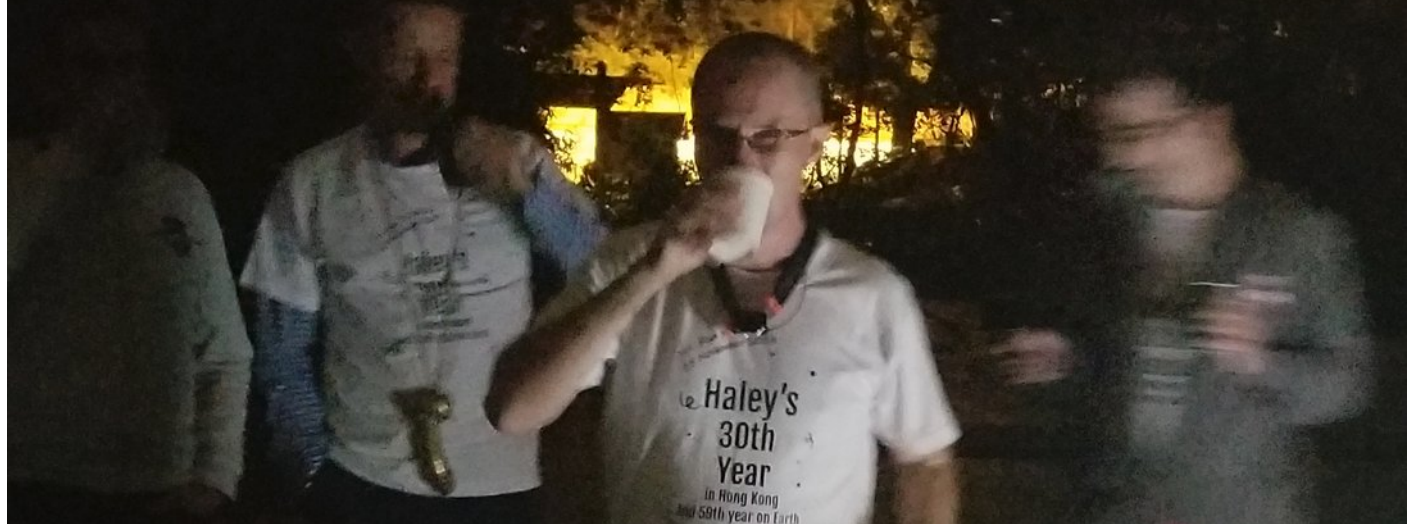


At 2.21km, Possibly the shortest H4 Run ever.

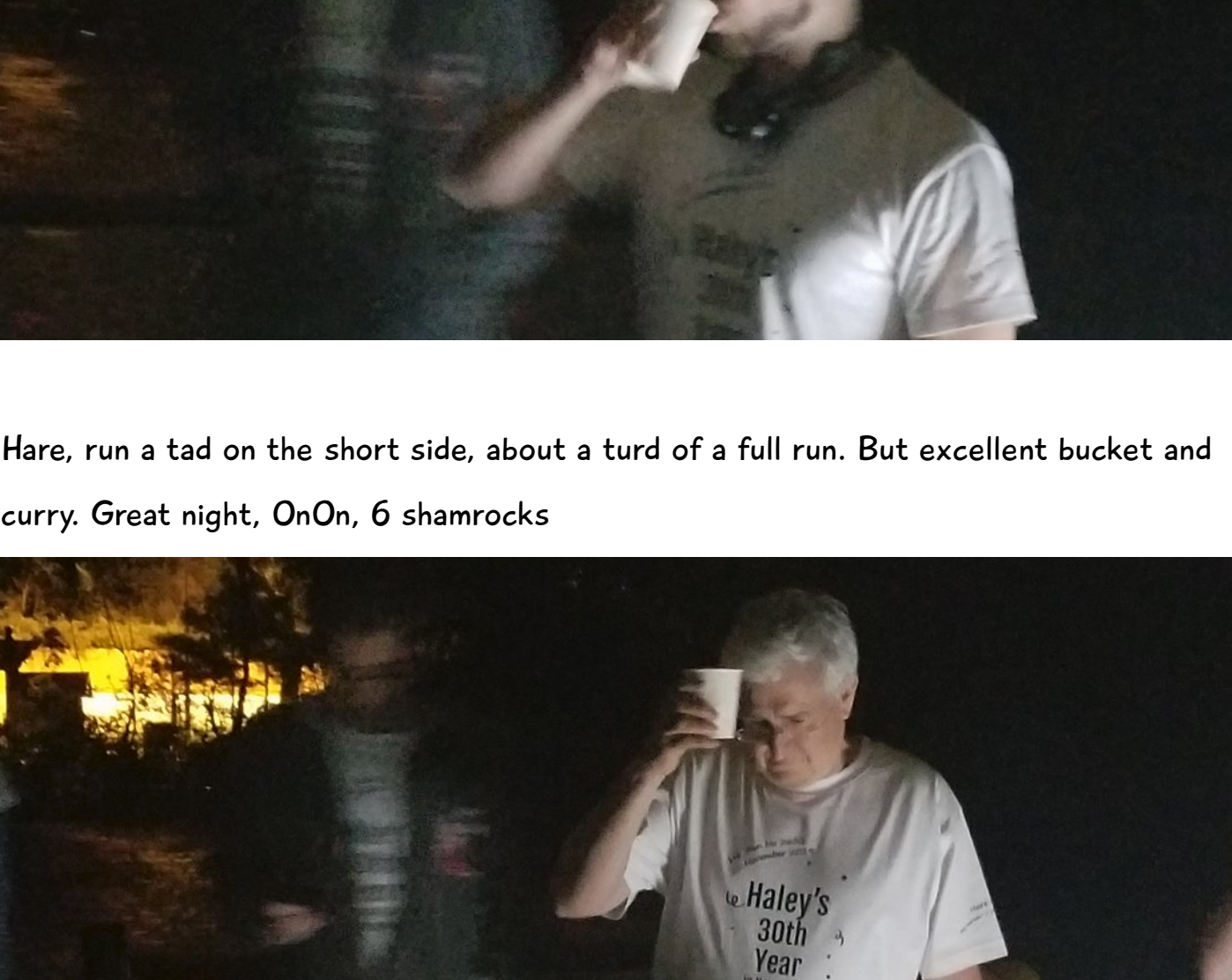

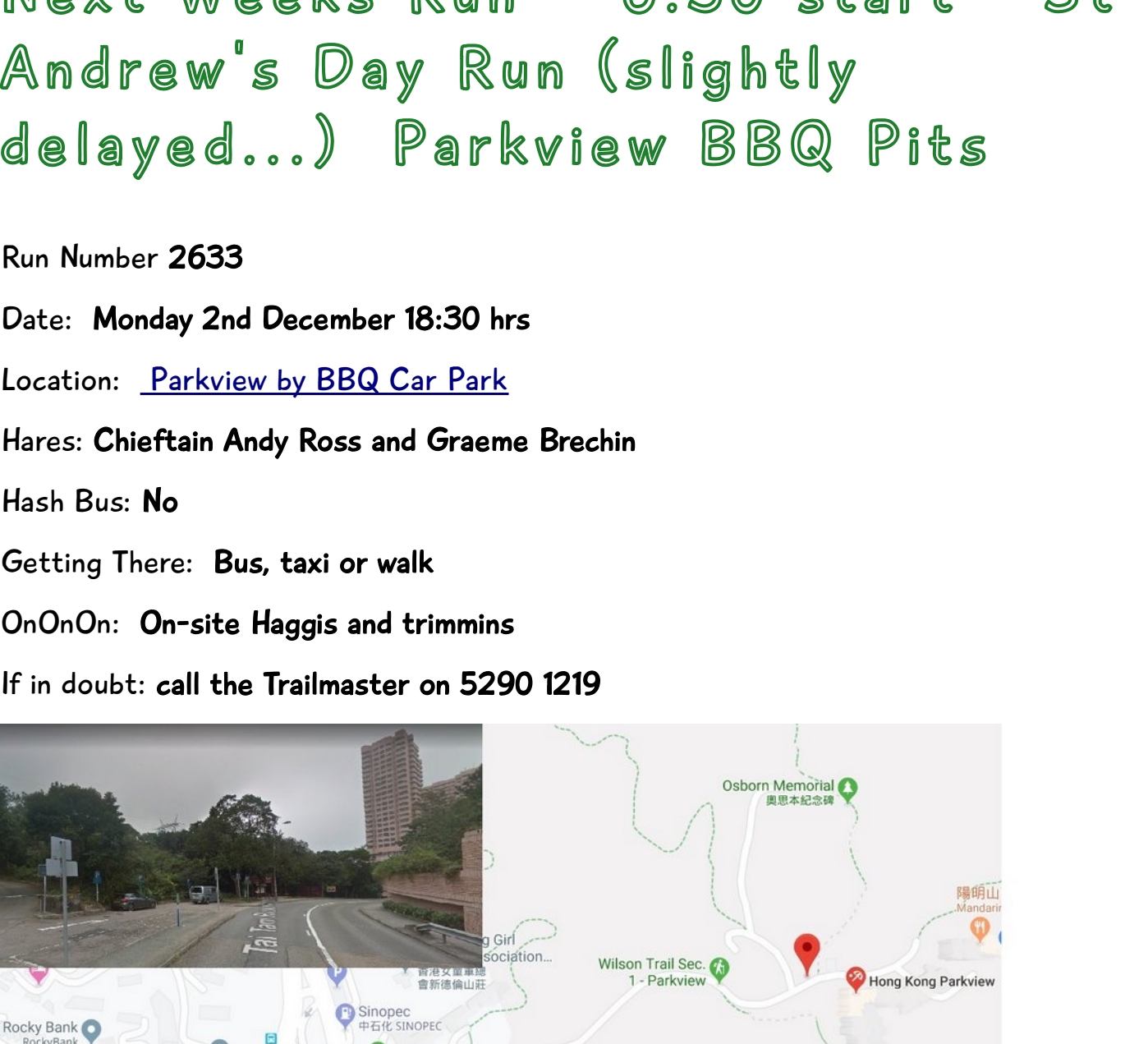
